Topic: Testimonial of the incubation project

I would like to express my sincere gratitude and appreciation for being one of the beneficiaries of the Incubator Hatchery Project. This initiative was incepted by the Community Project Zimbabwe in July 2023 at Suswe Business Center in Mudzi, Zimbabwe.

I am primarily a school teacher at a local school. I am into roadrunner chickens rearing. I keep two breeds, namely the Black australorp and Koekoe. I have a flock of 50 laying pullets and 10 cocks. I collect at least 40 fertilized eggs everyday.

Before the establishment of the incubation project at Suswe Business Centre I used to take my fertilized eggs to Mutoko for incubation which is more than 40 kilometres from my station. I was charged \$7 per crate for incubation. I had to endure the hassles of taking the eggs to Mutoko and to collect the chicks. Due to the erratic electricity supply, I had to stomach the pain and disappointments of low hatch rates.

These challenges prompted me to stop taking my eggs to Mutoko for incubation. I started selling the fertilized eggs as table eggs, which was not profitable at all. I was happy when I learnt of the incubation services at the local business centre which is a 20 minute walk from my place. The project boasts of a solar backup system so there are no worries if mains electricity is cut.

For a start, on the 13th of July 2023, I took 150 eggs to the new facility. I then took 120 eggs, 150 eggs and 120 eggs respectively at 5 days intervals. I was elated by the hatch rate which is over 90%. From the first 150 eggs, I realized 135 chicks. The beauty of the contract is that you give back 20% of the hatched chicks to the project for its sustainability. This arrangement is quite good for the community members who cannot afford hatchery fees pegged by other hatcheries.

Personally, I have boosted my income through selling of day old chicks. I now get over \$100 after every five days compared to \$20 over the same period after selling the eggs as table eggs. May all those behind this initiative stay blessed.

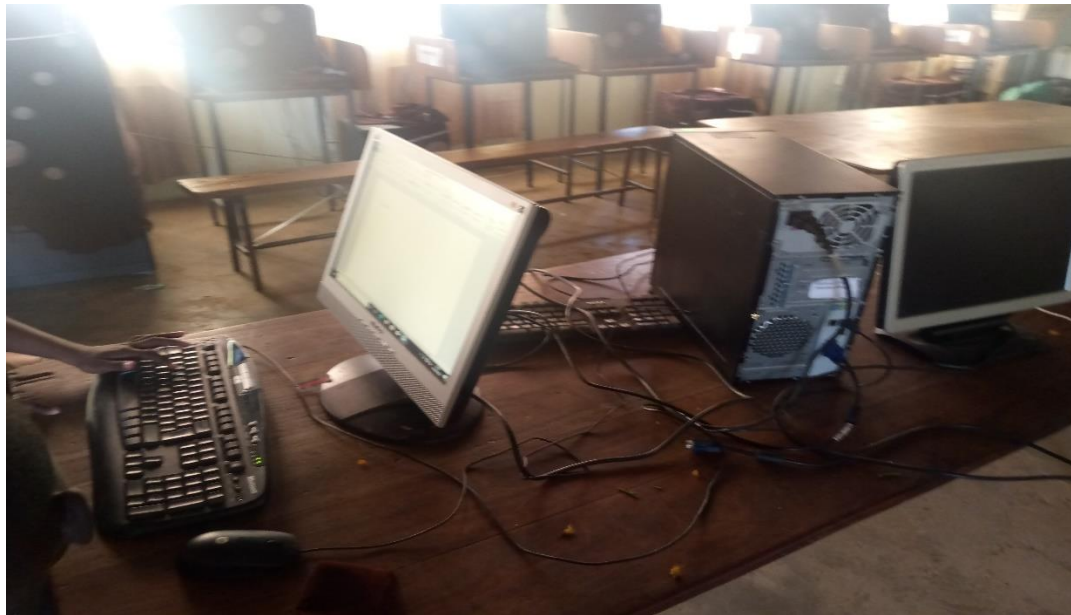
